School Update & Charter Renewal: Wendy

- o nearly all courses returning, three teachers now in their 7th or 8th year at LCS and one in her 2nd, one new class *Write a Book*, new after-school STEM Club
- o 50 students. 40% of students are new this year
- o van has been in constant use, taking students on frequent and more varied field trips
- o launched Teacher Peer Observation program, giving each faculty member the opportunity to observe a colleague's class, exchange feedback, and adopt new instructional strategies.
- o preparing to roll out our new mental health counseling program

Finances

- The financial position remains strong, no debt and over \$100,000 in reserves.

Charter renewal

charter schools must renew authorization every five years, updating the document to reflect current practice and needs. Site visit scheduled for October 28 likely from around 9:00-1:00. Outreach Committee Report - Katie

Committee will send new bylaws in January for review, to vote on at February board meeting.
- Cellphone policy- Wendy said the new cellphone free school is going well, there haven't been cellphones out in classes. A written policy is needed for the school. Julie looked at NH state law and examples of policies while working on it.

Building & Grounds Committee Report - Wendy and Chris

- Considering options for upstairs.
 - Chris met with construction consultant who gave possible options including pitless elevator, LULA (limited use limited access), elevator shaft on the outside of the building, top down elevator. Town of Lebanon gave requirement for a lift, Chris clarified lift is required not elevator
- How to best use the upstairs space.
 - Tech center? Which would not require a lift and could have a different entrance.
 - Air conditioning will probably be needed for any uses we decide on (to use for school or to rent out)
- Carine looking around at other buildings if considering moving to a new space. Currently, she hasn't seen anything that looks like it would meet the needs of the school.
- Looking at evacuation and safety plans.
- Wendy explains the electric bike company that sets up bike charging stations around the area, they proposed putting a charging station on LCS property and also wanted to put solar panels on the building roof. Proposed as a benefit for the company to have a spot near the tunnel, and for the school for advertising. No updates from the bike company since before school started.
- Concerns about random people on the property, sitting at the picnic tables, hiding behind dumpster using drugs
